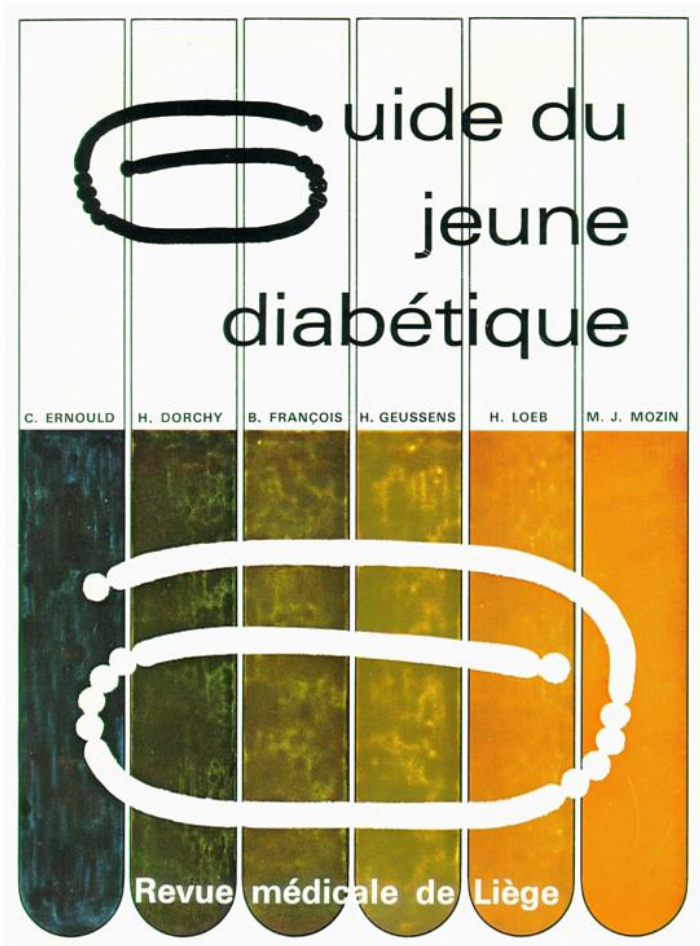

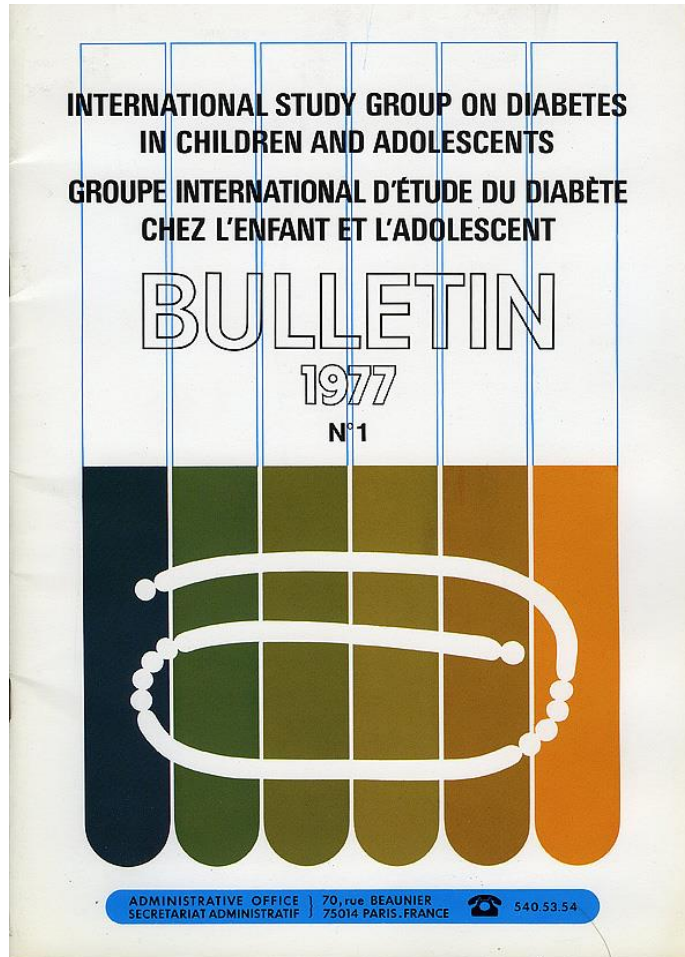

EVOLUTION OF ISGD/ISPAD LOGO WITH THE PROINSULIN MOLECULE



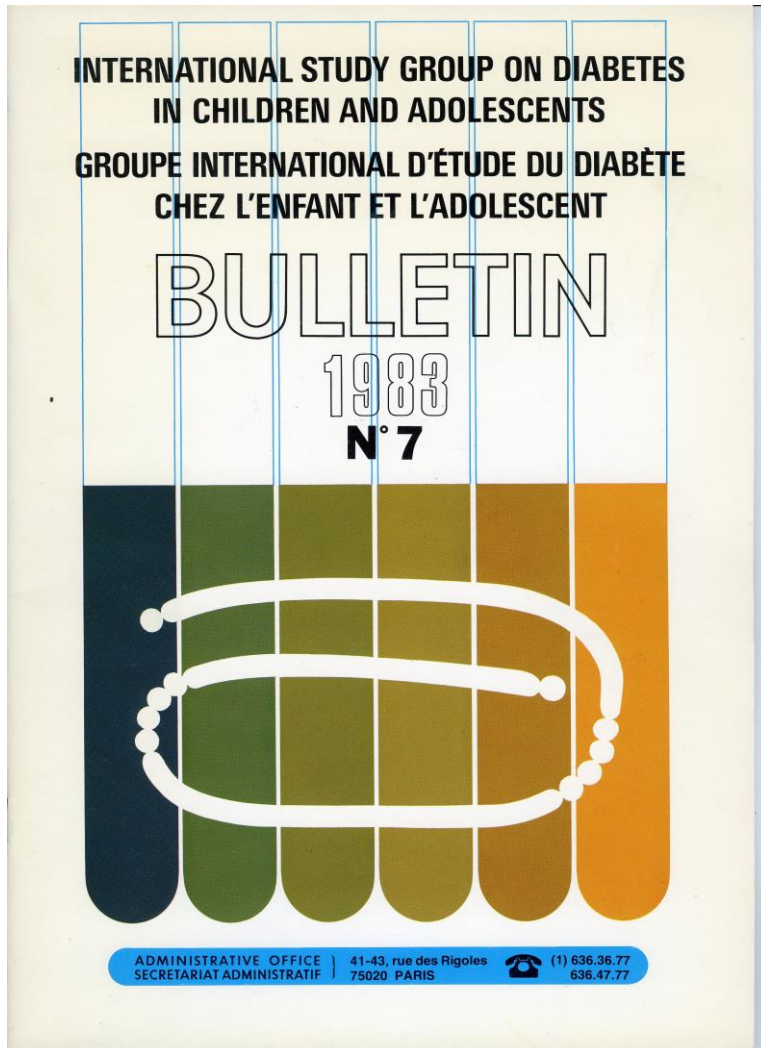

- In **1972**, Zvi Laron (Tel-Aviv), Henri Lestradet (Paris) and Helmut Loeb (Bruxelles) decided to create a separate pediatric association for the care and education of diabetic children & adolescents: the “International Study Group on Diabetes in Children and adolescents” (ISGD).
- The first “Bulletin” of ISGD was published in Brussels in **1977**, with nearly the same cover designed by Harry Dorchy’s father

SECRETARY-GENERAL'S REPORT FOR 1981/1982

STEERING COMMITTEE (SC):

According to the ISGD Constitution, Bruno WEBER's first 3-year term in office expired in 1982. After having been designated to be re-elected during last year's Business Meeting, he was now voted into office for another 3-year term.

Harry DORCHY was designated to be re-elected into the SC after expiration of his term in 1983. Therefore, at present the following members hold the three SC offices:

ADVISORY COUNCIL (AC):

In 1982 the terms of three AC-members expired: Hans K. ÅKERBLOM, Arlan L. ROSENBLUM, and Enrique VICENS-CALVET. According to the ISGD Constitution, both re-election and election of new AC-members were possible.

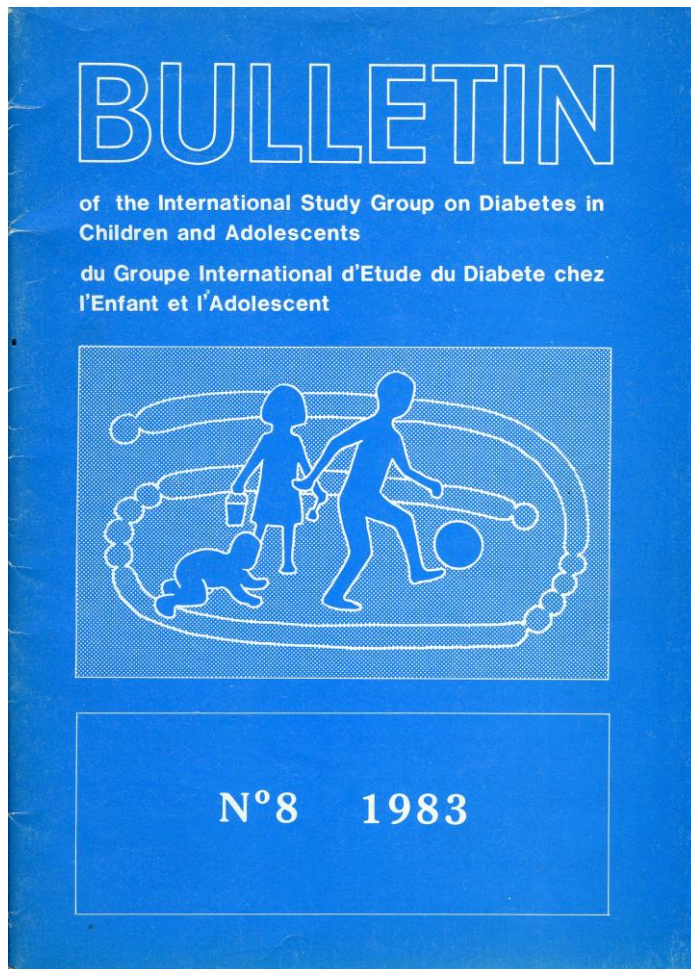

- In 1983, the editorial office leaves Brussels for Linköping (Sweden) and Johnny Ludvigsson became Editor
- He wrote: “To allow two issues per year the economy forces us to make a cheaper and less beautiful journal than up to now”
- The logo with the proinsulin molecule was completed by 3 children

Moderator: Harry DORCHY, Brussels/Belgium

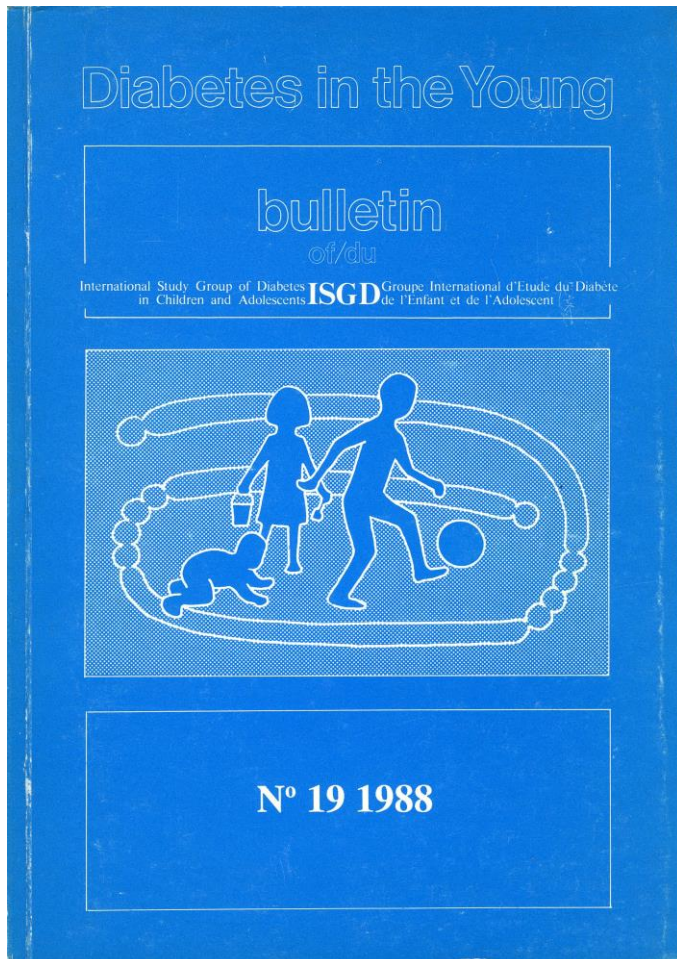

- In 1988, the logo didn't change
- The "Bulletin" became "Diabetes in the Young"
- Jan Bruining (Rotterdam, the Netherlands), Editor for 3 years, wrote in this issue:



Diabetes in the Young is growing out of its pants. It is the only journal that publishes on pediatric diabetology in a compiled fashion. The subjects encompass a multitude of topics: family studies, pediatric education, hypoglycemia, early manifestations of chronic complications and last but not least epidemiologic studies on IDDM in childhood.

The core of the journal is of course the proceedings of our annual meeting, providing such compiled information. Most of us submit the "best" of our papers to the official journals, where it finds its way in the scattering and vastness thereof. This is understandable as Diabetes in the Young is an informal journal, with all the charm that goes along with that fact.

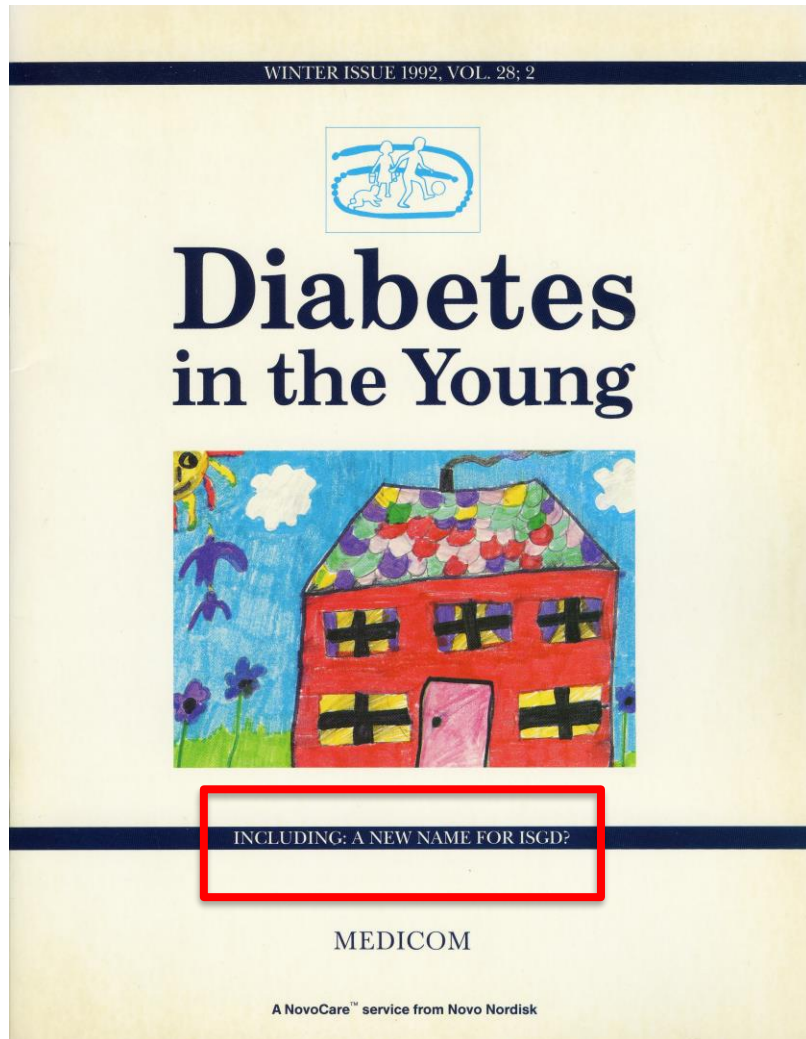
EVOLUTION OF ISGD/ISPAD LOGO WITH THE PROINSULIN MOLECULE



- In **1989**, the logo didn't change and was bigger
- “Diabetes in the Young” was the official Bulletin of ISGD and had undergone a radical change in style following a change in financial support of the bulletin
- Stephen Greene (Dundee, Scotland), was the new Editor
- ISGD had 150 members representing 30 countries
- There was a social program at low cost, creating friendly contacts, for participants and accompanying persons, which unfortunately disappeared in the years 2000

The tourist package for three days, including accommodation, meals and social programme for participants and accompanying persons, will cost 265 USD per person, with a supplement of 30 USD for a single room in TOPLICE Hotel and 195 USD, with a supplement of 25 USD for a single room in KOMPAS Hotel. For those who would like to come to Bled before October 23rd, each additional day (bed and breakfast) in the A Category Hotel would cost 50 USD for a single and 40 USD for a double room and in the B Category Hotel 25 USD for a single and 17 USD for a double room.

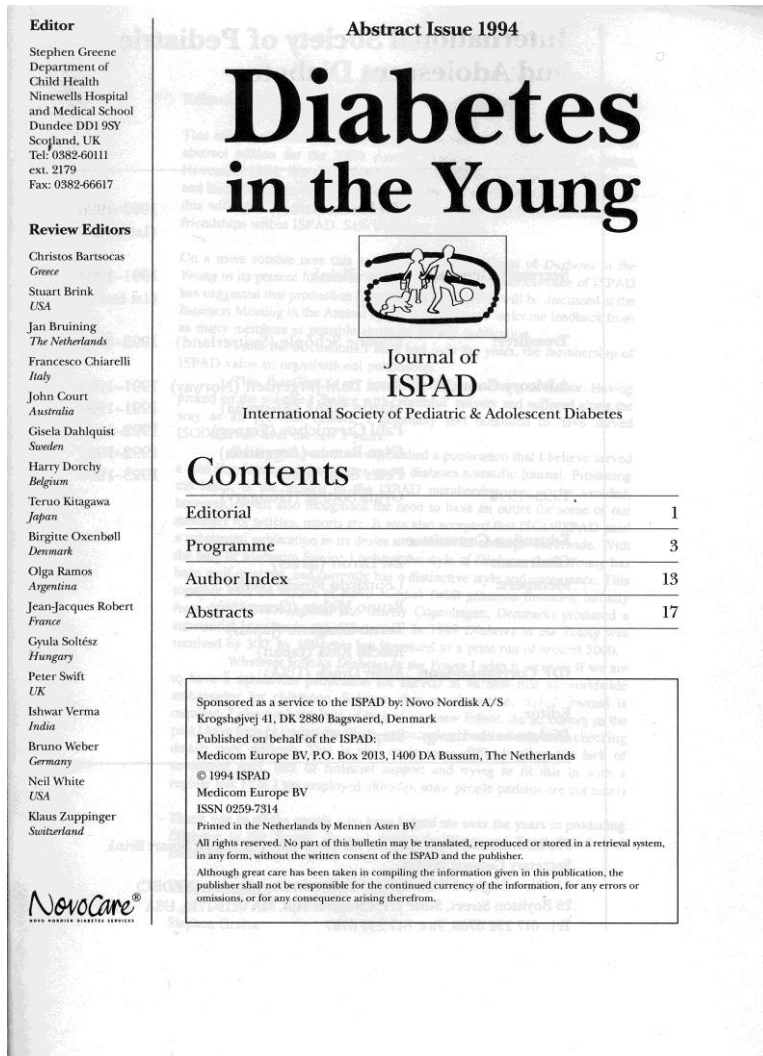
EVOLUTION OF ISGD/ISPAD LOGO WITH THE PROINSULIN MOLECULE



- In 1992, the smaller logo didn't change
- “The International Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Diabetes -ISPAD- was agreed to be the most appropriate name to lead the group into the 21st century”
- “A final decision will be taken at the next annual meeting in Greece”, organized by Christos Bartsocas

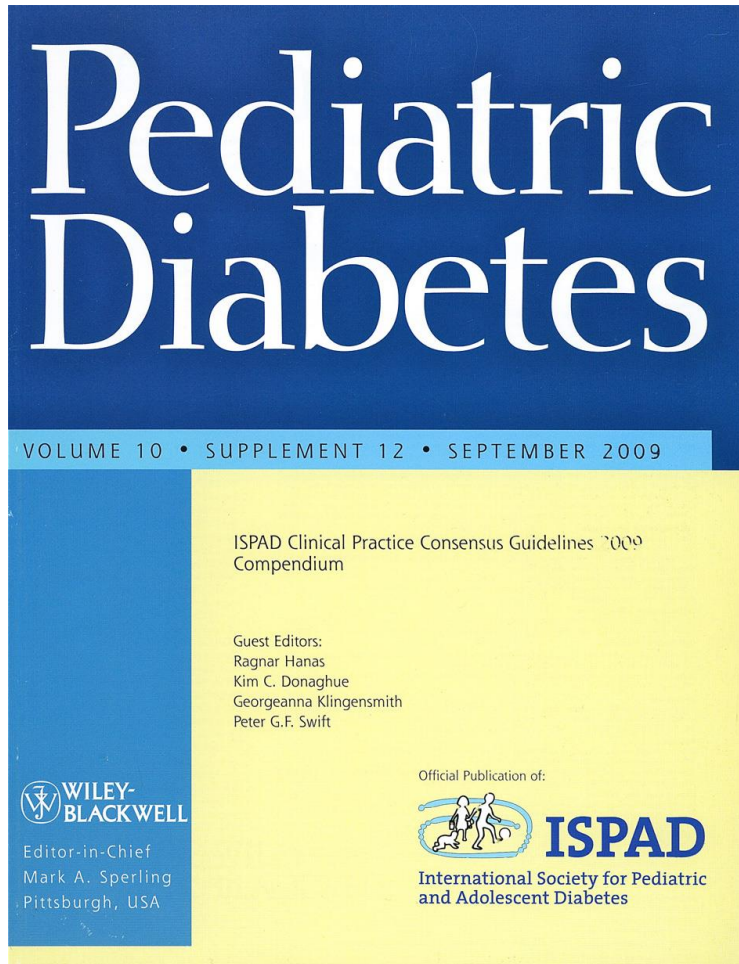

- In 1994, the logo didn't change
- Diabetes in the Young became the Journal of ISPAD
- Stephen Greene stopped producing Diabetes in the Young

This, therefore, is my last *Diabetes in the Young* as Editor. Having picked up the poisoned chalice with 'youthful' naivety and suffered along the way as all previous Editors, I genuinely feel honoured to have served ISGD/ISPAD over the last 5 years.

- In **2000**, appeared volume 1, issue 1 of “Pediatric Diabetes”
- Editor-in-Chief was Mark A. Sperling from Pittsburgh, USA
- The ISPAD logo was always the same
- In **2009**, the ISPAD Clinical Practice Consensus Guidelines were published on paper (in 2014, the following Guidelines were published online as well as “Pediatric Diabetes”)
- In 2009, ISPAD had 891 members from 89 countries. The impact factor of Pediatric Diabetes was 2.424 (3.488 in 2016)
- In **2013** the appearance of the cover changed and the logo was slightly modified
