On Wednesday, we used to have conference where entire week IPD cases were discussed with other pediatrics fellows and faculties. We also redesigned diabetic education booklet, wonderful experience. Monday and Thursday we used to have clinic in peripheries centers of hospital. Dr. Wood was so kind enough to pick and drop me each day. Clinic in those places used to be brain storming learning.

We also had Eid celebration in our department, fun with learning. It was "pot lock", I also contributed with vegetarian Indian dish.



At the end of my fellowship, Dr. Wood had organized a thrilling match of American Baseball with her family. It was my very first experience and oviously, Cleveland won.



I learnt holistic, patient-centric approach in Cleveland. All minor issue with patient of type 1 was managed with care by all experts, educators and social worker.
