Date: October 13-15, 2024

Location: Lisbon, Portugal

15 participants from Australia, Bangladesh, Brazil, Canada, Ireland, Italy, Jordan, Uganda, the United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom and United States of America took part in the Science School; representing chaplaincy, nursing, dietetics, psychology, public health, pharmacy and social work disciplines.

Organized and funded by the International Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Diabetes and BreakthroughT1D, the Science School gave attendees an understanding around critiquing research, developing a research question, research methodologies, data analysis and writing of grant applications.
